"Preparing for Jesus' Arrival"

According to our Christian tradition, "Advent" means coming or arrival: "This word has a double significance, as in Advent we celebrate Christ's coming into the world and look with longing for his coming again. The season of Advent begins with an emphasis on final things (eschatology). We watch and pray with expectant hope of the establishment of God's justice and the return of the Prince of Peace. As the weeks of Advent progress, the focus shifts to thanks and praise for the birth of the One who has already come—Jesus Christ our Savior. The origin of the season of Advent is uncertain. It may have been patterned after the season of Lent as a period of penitence before Christmas." (Book of Common Worship, p. 163, 2018)

As I read this brief synopsis about the meaning of Advent, I reflect on the idea of Advent being a period of penitence. According to the Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary, "penitence" implies a person's sad and humble realization of and regret for one's misdeeds (1980, p. 840). Our church practices this sacred act of penitence weekly. We pray every Sunday a prayer of confession in unison and in silence. Our unison prayer is printed in the bulletin. Our silent prayer is printed in our hearts.

In Luke's Gospel (11:24-26), Jesus tells a story about a man who cleansed his inner house of an evil spirit. That spirit wandered about and, finding nowhere else to live, finally returned to find its old house clean and tidied. This evil spirit then invited seven other spirits far worse than itself to come and live there with it. At first reflection it might seem Jesus was telling us not to cast out one evil habit lest seven worse ones come along. Actually, it was a matter of not going far enough.

We need to remember Christianity is concerned with more than just with the "Thou shalt nots." If we only remove evil and do not fill our inner empty houses with goodness, we have created a vacuum into which even greater evil can enter. Our religious and spiritual lives require an active performance of good and not just simply the removal of evil. Our thoughts and acts of unkindness toward another person require replacing them with positive thoughts and acts of kindness. (Hays, A Pilgrim's Almanac, p. 200, 1989)

Advent is a season of penitence where we are guided by the four Advent candles of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love to cleanse and scrub our inner houses of evil. Christmas is the season where the Star of Bethlehem guides us in decorating our inner houses with goodness and charitable deeds due to the birth of the One who has already come—Jesus Christ our Savior. NEWS FROM THE CLERK'S DESK

Christine Callender, Clerk of Session,

- The following items were discussed and approved at November's Session meeting.
- Scott Ostrom visited us to let us know his mothers memorials given to the church along with money
 Lillian set aside for the church, will be used to establish an endowment for our church. He and his
 wife will be getting it set up and they will be working with us to implement the usage of funds as Lillian would want. This endowment will be a living memorial to support various aspects of our church
 that Lillian loved.
- Per Capita for 2025 is \$30.69, total amount due by the end of 2025, \$3,222.00. This will get paid monthly, \$268.50, to the Presbytery. \$1,900.00 was moved into the savings account as part of our plan to build a 3-month savings fund to cover bills in case of hardships at the church.
- Next Presbytery Meeting is on December 10, 2024, in Flint.
- Viability meeting met on Oct. 10, 2024. They have gone through all the surveys and will be meeting on November 21, 2024, to begin planning.
- Car Show: Sept. 27, 2025; and Rummage Sale: Oct. 9 & 10, 2025- New date. These will be finalized at the December meeting.
- We have 2 outstanding memorials and with the funds that have come in from the car show, silent auction, vow renewal, & Pasties; those memorials will now be fulfilled. Then any remaining funds will be put into the savings for our savings fund.
- There has been a Board of Pensions change for Pastor. It helps save the church \$7,489.80. With that savings, we will be helping Jane with her Medicare and medicine cost and we will still be saving \$4,549.80. Session has approved this change.
- Missions would like to partner with the Birch Run/Taymouth CARE for the school for grades Preschool-3rd grade and help them collect winter things for those needing it. More details to come.
- Member Care will be taking care of Annual Meeting Luncheon.
- Pastor has been given one extra day of vacation and is adding it to next years' time as he was needed at the beginning of his last vacation this year. Christmas gifts will be given to the Pastor and volunteer staff this year. Next meeting December 10, 2024.



Dear Church Family and Friends!

The Finance Committee, with approval from Session, has made some decisions that will benefit the church. First, most event monies raised this past fall will be put into the savings account. Second, Rummage sale and Pasty profits will help pay for the elevator inspection and take care of two outstanding memorials- kitchen carts and security cameras. Third, Pastor Scott will receive an extra "Sunday" vacation day to be used next year. This vacation day is to replace the one he voluntarily gave up to help Deb and Rob Minard the day of Rob's medical emergency. The amount of this bonus day is \$150.00.

Next, our Per Capita commitment for 2025 is \$3,222.00. Session voted to request from Presbytery a deferred payment of \$268.50 per month. The per member rate for 2025 is \$30.69. The Basic Mission commitment to the Presbytery and General Assembly was approved at a yearly total of \$1000.00 or \$83.00 a month.


