"Memento Mori"

I received an early Halloween "Trick or Treat" gift for my 65th birthday this past August. The gift is a medallion about the size of a large silver dollar. The medallion itself, however, is not made of silver, but of a bronze alloy. What makes this medallion intriguing and "Halloween" looking is its portrait and inscription.

The front side (the obverse or the head-side) of the medallion is an interpretation of the 17th Century French painter Philippe de Champaigne's portrait, "Still Life with a Skull," which shows the three essentials of existence: the tulip (life), the skull (death), and the hourglass (time). These symbols of mortality encourage reflection on the meaning and fleetingness of life. The back side (the reverse or the tail-side) is inscribed with the phrase, "You Could Leave Life Right Now".

One might comment and say, "This is not a cheerful birthday gift." I agree, especially, when one turns 65 years old. Thus, I share the premise of this birthday gift with you for the season of Halloween as my "Trick or Treat" gift to you on the meaning of "Memento Mori."

In addition to the tulip, skull, and hourglass on the medallion's obverse side there is a Latin phase inscribed, "Memento Mori," which translates to "remember that you will die." Again, there is nothing like receiving a spooky birthday gift at the age of 65 years old reminding me I will die.

I discovered the premise of my birthday gift and your "Trick or Treat" gift comes from the philosophical teachings of the Roman Emperor and philosopher, Marcus Aurelius: "You could leave life right now. Let that determine what you do and say and think." (Meditations of Marcus Aurelius, Book II, Paragraph 11, Gregory Hays, p. 20, Modern Library Edition, 2002)

Marcus Aurelius reminded himself daily to live a life of virtue in the present moment and not wait. In the Bible, I find God teaching us the same. God does not want us to wait until tomorrow to live a virtuous life, but rather God wants us to live it now. As the Apostle Peter writes in his Second Letter: "For this very reason, you must make every effort to support your faith with goodness, and goodness with knowledge, and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with endurance, and endurance with godliness, and godliness with mutual affection, and mutual affection with love." (2 Peter 1:5-7 (NRSV)

May God's ultimate love expressed in the life of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, become your Halloween treat. Enjoy the sweetness of this divine treat, and be inspired to live a "Memento Mori," life.
